Orchestra. Over the years, Lennard has won prizes in numerous competitions and was awarded the scholarship from the Karajan Academy of the Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra for the 2021/2022 season. In November 2022, Lennard achieved second prize at the 7th Maurice André International Trumpet Competition in Paris. Since the 2022/2023 season, he has been principal trumpet of the Stuttgart State Orchestra.
